

2021 HYLAND VINEYARD PINOT NOIR

VINEYARD

Located in the McMinnville sub-AVA, Hyland Vineyard is one of Oregon's largest and oldest vineyards. The remote site sits in the eastern foothills of Coast Range, benefiting from cooler temperatures in the summer and warmer temperatures in the winter. The vineyard's established plantings thrive in the soil, microclimate, and high elevation unique to this site, which consistently produces fruit with structured tannins and bright acidity. Founding Winemaker Lynn Penner-Ash has been sourcing Pinot Noir and Riesling from the vineyard since 2008.

2021 VINTAGE

The 2021 growing season began with a winter ice storm, followed by rain at bloom and a heat dome in June. Overall yields were decreased due to the rain at bloom, but flavor intensity remained strong. A warm growing season kept berries small and concentrated. Much needed rains in early September extended the growing season, allowing the grapes a little extra hang time to build up flavor and balance acidity.

TASTING NOTES

This wine opens with black cherry and pepper notes. Layers of toasted oak and spice mix with dark fruit that melts into a confectionary finish.
